William T. Sherman Papers

This month the LOC has unveiled a new collection of manuscripts and other documents. The papers of General William Tecumseh Sherman (1820-1891) span the years 1810-1897, contain approximately 18,000 items, and include correspondence, a volume of recollections during and after the Mexican War, military documents, printed matter, memorabilia, and manuscripts of Sherman's *Memoirs*.

Jacob Riis Exhibition

Jacob Riis: Revealing "How the Other Half Lives" is a co-presentation of the Library of Congress and the Museum of the City of New York, containing items from the Library's Jacob A. Riis Papers and the museum's Jacob A. Riis Collection of photographs. The exhibition explores the life of Jacob Riis, a late-19th/early-20th century newspaper reporter and writer, whose stories and photographs of the squalid conditions in New York City's tenements led to social reform.
